FREEDOM IS NEVER VOLUNTARILY GRANTED BY THE OPPRESSOR. IT MUST BE DEMANDED BY THE OPPRESSED. JJ Chicago Freedom Movement Rally Speech, July 10, 1966

66 I AM NOT UNMINDFUL THAT SOME OF YOU HAVE COME HERE OUT OF GREAT TRIALS AND TRIBULATIONS. SOME OF YOU HAVE COME FRESH FROM NARROW JAIL CELLS. SOME OF YOU HAVE COME FROM AREAS WHERE YOUR QUEST FOR FREEDOM LEFT YOU BATTERED BY THE STORMS OF PERSECUTION AND STAGGERED BY THE WINDS OF POLICE BRUTALITY. YOU HAVE BEEN THE VETERANS OF CREATIVE SUFFERING. CONTINUE TO WORK WITH THE FAITH THAT UNEARNED SUFFERING IS REDEMPTIVE..... LET US NOT WALLOW IN THE VALLEY OF DESPAIR. 33

You may well ask: 'Why direct action? Why sit-ins, marches, and so forth? Isn't negotiation a better path?' You are quite right in calling for negotiation. Indeed, this is the very purpose of direct action. Nonviolent direct action seeks to create such a crisis and foster such a tension that a community which has constantly refused to negotiate is forced to confront the issue. It seeks so to dramatize the issue that it can no longer be ignored. **J**

"Letter from Birmingham Jail," written April 12–20, 1963

Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. Never again can we afford to live with the narrow, provincial 'outside agitator' idea. Anyone who lives inside the United States
